Greetings Professor Olsen,

I have concluded the revisions made to the original overview of the College of Applied Professional Studies to improve clarity, accessibility, and comprehensiveness on the landing page and two academic degree programs. The updates aimed to provide a better understanding of the college and these two academic degree programs by presenting them in a structured, readable, and informative manner.

The website contained dense, wordy language that could be uninteresting to individuals who want direct information about a sought-after program. I simplified the language to make the content easier to read without sacrificing accuracy. In doing so, the information is more approachable for a wider audience, promoting greater comprehension while allowing individuals to skim without missing information. I changed some of the languages for the Organizational Leadership (Veterans, Society, and Service) page to reflect a more military-centric approach. As an active-duty military student, I believe that military-focused degree plans in a simple, yet familiar language may attract more individuals with a service background. By making the average person the targeted audience while also focusing on military members for defense-specific degrees, I could condense the information significantly.

I had avoided changing the outline completely due to researching other colleges' degree websites. There is a format on each website that makes it easy to browse and look for information, so I focused strictly on the content of the website. I organized the content into clear sections with headings and significantly condensed the language.

Benefits of the Revised Document:

- Clear and Concise: Individuals, especially those between 18-25, get easier information to understand and easy to search for.
- Educational Resource: The document can educate several age groups and removes a lot of "filler" to avoid a textbook feel or being overwhelming at t
- Military-friendly: ASU has been ranked one of the most military-friendly schools in the United States. To continue the promise of taking care of those who have served, I made sure to adjust the language to something familiar to them.

The updated document provides a comprehensive summary of the APS website, emphasizing key formats that can be applied to all the degree plans while staying synchronized with other colleges' websites at ASU.





APPLIED SCIENCE (Technical Communications) BAS

Technical communication is applied workplace communication that makes technical information understandable and available to many audiences. In the technical communication concentration, students learn how to produce, design and manage information using both traditional and developing technologies.

The BAS in applied science with a concentration in technical communication is designed for students with an AAS degree from a regionally accredited institution. This major combines the technical experience gained from an associate degree program with a broader education of skills in management, leadership, critical thinking, and communication.

This major is eligible for the Western Undergraduate Exchange program at the following location: Polytechnic campus. Students from Western states who select this major and campus may be eligible for reduced nonresident tuition at a rate of 150% of Arizona resident tuition plus all applicable fees. Students should click the link for more information and eligibility requirements of <u>the WUE program</u>.

STEM-OPT for international students on F-1 visas

This program may be eligible for an Optional Practical Training extension for up to 24 months. This OPT work authorization period may help international students gain skills and experience in the U.S. Those interested in an OPT extension should <u>review ASU degrees that qualify for the STEM-OPT extension</u> at ASU's International Students and Scholars Center website.

The OPT extension only applies to students on an F-1 visa and does not apply to students completing a degree through ASU Online.
